How can you participate?

Communities



- * Publicly announce Celtic Awareness Week in your community and raise the Celtic flags
- * Host Celtic lectures/entertainment at Community-owned venues
- * Encourage your citizens and businesses to participate
- * Work with citizens or organized Celtic groups in your community to plan and execute Celtic awareness events
- * Subsidize free entry to or extended hours for community-owned museums, studios, and other venues that are providing historic and cultural displays honouring New Brunswick Celtic heritage

Schools



- * Have children identify the flags of the Irish, Scottish and Welsh
- * Encourage students to talk to family members and write about their own family heritage
- * Invite a lecturer to speak to the children about Celtic heritage in New Brunswick
- * Encourage students to prepare a presentation on Celtic New Brunswick
- * Provide Celtic themed puzzles, colouring sheets, games (check with a local Association for materials)
- * Spread the word about any activities in your community for Celtic Awareness Week
- * Participate in as many activities taking place as possible—and bring friends!

Individuals



- * Show your ethnic pride by hanging the flag of your ancestry at home
- * Volunteer to organize a Celtic Family Walking Parade in your community
- * Volunteer to encourage your local businesses to participate
- * Spread the word about any activities in your community for Celtic Awareness Week
